

Staffing

Sally Martin and Ben vanderLoos have yet to receive appointments but will be leaving us. We will miss these valuable contributors to our school!
- We are currently recruiting new teachers and filling 2020 SSO positions.

School Improvement Update

Many of you have no doubt heard that we have implemented Read Write Inc (RWInc), a synthetic phonics approach, to teach reading. There are two phases in the reading process – "Learning to Read" and the "Reading to Learn". We are thrilled with the progress we are making with teaching students to read this year. We started the year with all Years R-6 students (except 8 who were already independent readers) involved in RWInc. We now have 31 independent readers in Year 4-6 and 15 in R-3. We are very hopeful of some more getting through before the end of the year. This means that we will have **at least a 500% increase in the number of independent readers to start 2020.**

2020 Planning

- We have been successful in our application to be a Trauma Aware School in 2020-2021 and are currently negotiating Berry Street support for our staff.
- Preschool to Year 6 transition is underway. Students are 'trying out' preschool to 7/8 learning environments. With so many staff changing over, not all are meeting their 2020 teacher but there are a range of activities happening to prepare students for 2020.
- We are planning the First Week of 2020. These 4 days are an opportunity to establish expectations and routines, set goals, befriend new people and gain an appreciation of what's ahead.
- We are redescribing our school values (especially for younger students), these are:
 - Respect and Be Kind
 - Responsibility and Be Safe
 - Resilience and Work Hard.

Other News

- Years 4-8 students enjoyed a visit from the Solar Challenge team.
- Our Art students are preparing a range of fabulous paintings on boards for OZ Minerals.
- Our whole school production, Suessical Jn was a huge success. Given it was a much more complex show than we expected, we're




impressed with how our students 'stepped up'. Fabulous in school and community feedback – well done Jason and team!!

- We started "Success Lunch" on Fridays students are invited to eat their lunch with the leadership team and receive a certificate and Tim Tam for a 'success' – such as progressing multiple RWInc levels, great projects, being caring, reflecting school values etc. This is an opportunity to celebrate some of our quiet achievers and enjoy children's pride in their achievements.
- Our Alternate Learning Centre (NIAA) funded central shade looks fantastic. Planning is underway to put a range of seats and garden beds in there for a central gathering area.
- Our new school signage is going up looking great! Along with the new grass. A water fountain and a new front door, the front of the school is looking terrific.
- Last Monday we had a visit from CEG, Oz Minerals and PASS to support our students with career pathway decision making. Year 9-12 met with the group and after school there was a community meeting. We are very appreciative of the support we are receiving to ensure our students all have pathways after school.





Dress Code Proposal:

The Coober Pedy Area School Governing Council supports the wearing of school uniform because uniform:

- Reflects pride in the school and supports a sense of • identity & belonging.
- Reduces peer pressure and competition about clothing choices.
- Contributes to student safety by enabling staff to easily identify any outsider who might come into the school grounds.

• Supports students to develop attitudes and habits that they will use in life after school and at work.

Coober Pedy Area School uniforms are available online at <u>https://eduthreads.com.au/</u> where you use the 'Find Your School' option. There is a full range of uniform items on the website. There are options for families to use sponsorship of groups such as AMYAC.

Proposed 2020 Expectations:

- The Governing Council appreciates that a DRESS CODE is better accepted by some families, so their 'at school' expectation is that all students always wear the school colours and are in a school top.
- Students are required to wear school uniform when engaged in school activities out the school unless otherwise specified. Exceptions are applied to activities such as TAFE programs, SAASTA or Choir camp.
- A navy blue hat (available through eduTHREADS <u>https://eduthreads.com.au/</u>) in a bucket or full brim style is required in Terms 1 and 4 and preferred in Terms 2 and 3. The school follows Sun Safe policies. Students not wearing hats are required to move to a shaded area.

Safety expectations:

- Footwear should be appropriate for school, e.g. sneakers, plain shoes, boots and sandals (with a back strap). High heels and thongs are inappropriate as they limit access to physical activities.
- Shoulders and midriff should be covered at all times.
- All school workshops are covered by Government Regulations. Students will wear appropriate clothing and footwear as well as protective equipment as directed by staff when working in Technical Studies, Science Laboratories, Art and Home Economics classrooms.

Jewellery and Make-Up:

 Wearing of jewellery at school is not usually safe, especially during PE and yard play.



- A watch, medical bracelet or necklace (school must be notified of the reason), sleepers or small studs or a simple ring are acceptable.
- Make-up is NOT appropriate for school.

2019 CONSULTATION PROCESS for 2020 Policy adoption:

Under the **Dress Code Regulations:** Education Regulations 1997 (part 5 – 77) on school dress code, Governing Councils have the right to determine school dress policy. Consultation is required.




