#### **TEACHING AND LEARNING SPOTLIGHT**

#### **SACE Geography Camp- Adelaide**

During the week, our Years 11/12 Geography class attended a field trip in Hallett Cove, Adelaide. Students worked in small groups to investigate the environmental characteristics of an individual section of sand dunes along the Hallett Cove coastline. They used a range of methods to observe, measure and record fieldwork data, including soil pH, soil moisture content, vegetation type and amount, number of beach users and litter. Students analysed the environmental characteristics of the sand dune and the impact of people on the natural environment. They made recommendations on possible environmental strategies for the protection of the Hallett Cove coastline. Our Year 11/12 Geography demonstrated their ability to work collaboratively and productively as a team.













#### Years 9/10 Science

In Science, the Years 9/10 students have been learning about cell theory which involves cell division and the transmission of heritable characteristics from one generation to other. They recently performed an experiment where they collected and observed their cheek cells and onion skin cells under a compound microscope to understand the differences between animal and plant cells. Students engaged in this task and were curious to learn more. Once they finished their task, they looked at other things, living and non-living, around them to observe and learn how they are different from us. They have been learning about Mitosis (cell division) and will soon move on to Meiosis (cell division of reproductive cells) to learn about genes and heredity. I applaud their engagement, commitment and hard work. Well done!

In maths, we have been using our efficient counting and grouping strategies to find out how many counters are in our class jar. We recorded the amounts of each individual colour and then used MAB and addition to find the total. Our work aligns with the research and evidence of using manipulatives in the teaching of maths to build student conceptual understanding.
