TEACHING AND LEARNING SPOTLIGHT


Reception Class

Years 1/2 Class (1) - Mathematics

In Mr Brady's 1/2 maths class, we have been learning everything there is to know about the numbers to 100! Here are three activities that we have been focusing on:

Build the wall! – We need to build a wall to 100 that is only ten bricks high. We can only add the numbers to our wall that are on the dice. This helps us remember different ways to make 10, and how many groups of tens and ones are in each number.

Number Maze: A lot of the numbers on our hundreds chart have been blocked out. How are we going to know which numbers are left? We need to use our counting forwards and backwards by ones and tens to help us here! Ten frame filler game: We need to fill the ten frames by rolling the dice. This helps us know the different ways we can make 10!





The Learning Hub

We have been working hard in the Learning Hub this term. Naomi worked on small science experiments, mixing different types of dry material such as citric acid, sodium acetate and sodium bicarbonate to liquids of different densities to observe its effects. She was also consistent in completing her daily Multilit module. Naomi observed the difference in temperatures between sand exposed to the sun and in shade and described the different sensations when felt with her hands. Charlie has also been very consistent in his attendance and showed progress both in his literacy and numeracy. Together with Mrs Comer, he extended himself in recognising and sounding out vowels and letters in his name. Charlie is also exploring different emotions and ways to draw them on animal faces to show their emotions. Blake is another high achiever in the Learning Hub. He has been very positive and showcased his growth mindset in working on his handwriting and creative writing tasks. Blake has shown lots of progress in his writing and linguistic abilities, which he should be very proud of. Well done

From Secondary/SACE

In Stage 2 Workplace Practices students will be completing five assessment tasks: two folio tasks that explore workplace culture, a portfolio based on a work experience or a TAFE block, a reflection, and an investigation.

Stage 1 Ancient Studies

Stage 1 Ancient Studies students will be completing four assessment tasks: a newspaper about the Qin Dynasty, a historical rebuttal about Assyrian warfare, a crime briefing about ancient artifacts and antiquities, and an independent inquiry.


Years 8/9 HASS

In 8/9 HASS students will be exploring the First World War. The 8/9s have already begun this unit by exploring the short- (the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand) and long-term causes (Militarism, Alliances, Imperialism, Nationalism) of the First World War, and they have begun working on their assignment for this topic; a crime scene board where they will prove who or what started the First World War. The 8/9s will also be undertaking an independent HASS project that will be based around a History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship, or Economics and Business topic.

9/10 HASS

In 9/10 HASS students will be exploring important historical events and pop culture from the 1940s through to the 2010s. The 9/10s have already begun this unit by exploring what culture and pop culture is and the key events of the 1940s. The 9/10s have also enjoyed playing the A-Z Relay Game where they have to work together to list one word for each letter of the alphabet according to the topic. So far the matches have been enthusiastic and too close to call! Please note some photos are pre-lockdown.

Please see below:

Face masks in schools, preschools and children's centres
