We look forward to your continual support of our school and students in these exciting times in our public education system and in particular at Coober Pedy Area School.




We look forward to more exciting learning opportunities for all our students for the rest of the school year.


#### **TEACHING AND LEARNING SPOTLIGHT**

#### Years 1/2 - Mr Geoff Brady's Class

In Mathematics, our focus has been on the Big Idea of **Place Value**. We have been learning to become the quickest at counting that we possibly be! Counting things one by one is so slow and boring, so to count a lots things, we can just put it into groups of tens, and see what is left over! This is so much quicker, because rather than having to count one by one, we can count by tens! We tried this counting method on everything we could see in the classroom. The things we counted were: pop sticks, whiteboard markers, blocks, counters, magnets, books, dice, dominoes, abacus beads, straws and even the letters on a speed sounds chart!! Everything is much quicker when you count by tens!!




In Literacy, we have been focusing on phonological awareness and vocabulary in both our RWInC lessons and our additional literacy lessons





#### VACCINATION HUB- 2ND ROUND

Our school has been selected as one of the school sites in South Australia to be a vaccination hub for our students, staff, families and the wider community.

This is a local community opportunity for you and your child/ren to be vaccinated if you would like to but haven't yet had the opportunity.

All students aged 12 and over are eligible, and will require parental consent to be vaccinated as part of this program during school hours.

Consent packages for eligible students has been provided to us by SA Health and were sent out last week to parents/caregivers.

Only students with parental consent will be vaccinated during school hours.

The dates and times for the vaccinations are as follows:

Dose 1 for community (including the school): Wednesday, 10 Nov 21 from 14:30 to 20:30 Dose 1 for school: Thursday, 11 Nov 21 from 08:00 to 12:00

Dose 2 for the community (including the school): Wednesday, 01 Dec 21 from 14:30 to 20:30

Dose 2 for your school: Thursday, 02 Dec 21 from 08:00 to 12:00

Parents/Caregivers and community members are welcome to have a vaccination (See the above schedule).

An after-hours clinic will also be held at our hub and students and family members can attend (see above schedule).

The vaccination team will deliver the first dose of the vaccine and return 3 weeks later to deliver the second dose (see above schedule).

The school vaccination hub is an important part of South Australia's COVID-19 vaccination program. We welcome the opportunity to be involved and provide this service to our school and local community.

Our site-specific safety precautions/measures in response to the COVID-19 pandemic continues to be in place.


All **visitors** to our site are required to come Through the **front office/reception and sign in and sign out on departure.**
