Our Students in Year 1, will be taking part in the annual Phonics Screening Check (PSC). Please contact us if you require any further details about this.





VIPE SCHOOL

Years 1/2 Class- Ms Laura Brooks

Our students in the Years 1/2 class have been learning about 2D & 3D shapes in Maths. We created 2D face shapes and in the process learning explored the attributes of 2D shapes. Students have learnt about pentagons, hexagons, and octagons as well as squares, rectangles, circles, and ovals. They have also been learning about 3D shapes, their names and attributes.



In literacy, students have been working hard in RWI, practicing their sounds and consolidating their reading abilities, in Talk for Writing (TfW) students have been learning about setting, we looked at the story The Gumleaf Thief, focusing on the descriptive language, characterisation and using time of day and weather to set the scene of a story. Students have also been building their grammar knowledge by learning and practicing the use of adjectives, verbs, nouns, and adverbs. Overall the Year 1/2 students have been working very hard learning and practicing their literacy and numeracy skills. Very excited to see how they continue to learn throughout the term.

In maths students have been working on multiplication and division, looking at the relationship between them. Students have practiced a range of strategies for multiplication and division using their understanding of place value and their knowledge of how numbers can be manipulated to come up with a list of strategies that work for them.





Students have looked at how fact families can be used to explore the relationship between multiplication and division. They have also explored using arrays to represent multiplication and division of number sentences. Students have worked hard on these concepts, persevering when presented with some challenging problems.



Years 8/9 English and HASS

The Years 8/9 class has been examining the how and why of World War 1 (WW1). We discussed and researched the reasons why it began as well as Australia's involvement. The reasons for the outbreak of this conflict were complex but was basically about countries looking to expand their borders at the expense of local communities. The world virtually led to the division of countries into two groups, Great Britain against Germany with their allies.






I think the most important lesson that we as students can learn from this History time period is that war is a terrible occurrence and the consequences that face humanity incur untold suffering.



A feature of our study is to choose a topic such as nationalism, imperialism or women of this time period, research it and analyse its role in WW1.



The novel Gallipoli by Alan Tucker has given the Years 8/9 English class an insight into life in the trenches of WW1.



As the text has been read and discussed students have been able to analyse the feelings of leading characters.



Students learnt about how an author influences their audience for a particular purpose in this case the devastation and pointlessness of war.



This remarkable event took place at the Adelaide Convention Centre, where participating schools provided highly positive feedback.




As a well-deserved reward, the students enjoyed a fun-filled weekend that included a bounce and tree climb session.

We would like to remind parents/caregivers and students that energy drinks such as "Red Bull" are not permitted at Coober Pedy Area School.


