
We have shared some of our learning moments in this newsletter as always. We have seen an increase in the participation rate for our Years 3-10 students in the PAT Testing this year.

Join me in congratulating Mrs Sharlene Jeffree (SSO) for receiving her 20 years' service recognition from the Department.







Our Years 3/4 students have been learning about levers, pivot points, pneumatics and hydraulics to create a remotely operated articulated mechanism.




















Years 8, 9 & 10 English & HASS

Students were required to respond by analyzing key features such as character, setting and language conventions which they then adopted as they created their own short stories or fictional texts.





Please also be mindful that we are a **nut free** school.


A number of students have allergies to peanuts and other nuts.
